The Passback story does not originate with a grandiose tale or a watershed moment, but with a dusty closet filled with sporting equipment. A little spring cleaning led to the excavation of a sports gear closet in the SEI founder's - the Moylan family's - home in 1989. That's when it dawned on the Moylans - if they had a closet full of unused equipment that was new or close to new, it may follow that their customers did, too.

When a family friend requested on behalf of the American Peace Corps to make a purchase of gear to bring along on a trip to Malawi, Africa, the Moylan family and SEI put two and two together. Rather than allow the Peace Corps to purchase the goods, Sports Endeavors made a donation of soccer balls and jerseys to the group, and the first ever Passback was made.

In 1991, Passback made a formal entry into the Sports Endeavors initiative, and with the help of our generous customers and users, was quickly making more than 5,000 donations per year. That number would rise steadily until it needed new avenues and greater resources to continue to grow.

In 2002, SEI and the U.S. Soccer Foundation joined forces to expand the Passback program's reach and distribution capabilities. 50,000+ shipments per year would quickly become a reality in the years following the partnership, as would large shipments to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom and Haiti following the 2010 earthquake.

Sports Endeavors and the U.S. Soccer Foundation are proud to have reached over 100 countries worldwide, giving players entire oceans and continents apart a path to the beautiful game.

Now, after thirty years of cross-continental-passbacks, we turn our attention to our own backyard, looking for your charitable donations to help us grow and expand the world's game inside the United States.

She wanted to tell me a story regarding Passback. You see, in the States when you have soccer-playing children, you often write their name or address or phone number on their soccer ball or cleat or other equipment. Kids tend to misplace things, so parents write phone numbers and such on the equipment so it can be returned.

This mother did that for her children and eventually, she donated some of that material to the Passback Program. They got shipped off to a community in need.

Eventually, this mother got a letter from the recipient of the gear. The letter was a simple thank you note, but it had this mother crying tears of joy because something that was no longer of use to her or her little one was something that was now being cherished by someone else.

For me, I always think about that idea, about this project coming full circle.
